Tiny Tim Trophy

This trophy was named after a much loved pony called Tiny Tim who was part of Dayboro Pony Club for many years. It is awarded to a child aged 11 years or under who has demonstrated great sportsmanship, general improvement in their level of riding and horsemastership skills and compassion and care for their horse and fellow riders. The recipient will have represented the club with pride.



Helen Gray Trophy

This is awarded to a rider aged between 12 and 18 years who has demonstrated great sportsmanship, general improvement in their level of riding and horsemastership skills and compassion and care for their horse and fellow riders. The recipient will have represented the club with pride.



New Member Trophy

This is awarded to a new club member who has shown the greatest improvement over the course of the year.



Muster Trophy

This is awarded to the rider who has accrued the highest points for attendance and presentation at musters throughout the year.



President's Trophy

The President's Trophy is awarded to a rider who has represented the club well at Zone, State or National level. The winner is chosen by the President in consultation with instructors. It is based on criteria including achievement, sportsmanship, horsemastership and setting an example for younger members.



Senior's Trophy

This is awarded to a senior rider who has demonstrated good horsemastership and sportsmanship throughout the year.



Head Over Heels Trophy

This trophy is the one no one wants to win - as the name suggests, it is awarded for the best fall of the year!
